



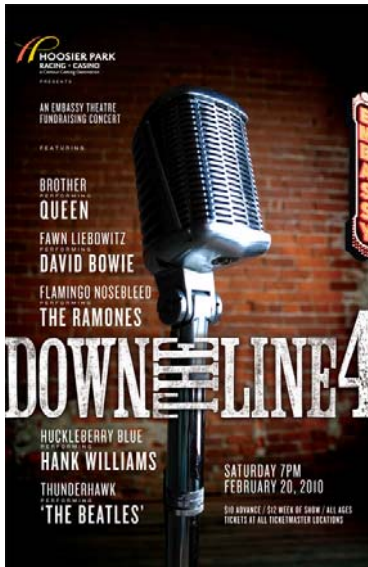

Brother will bring the Queen experience to the Embassy Theatre stage. Created by twin brothers, hence the name, Mike and Mark Magdich, the band also includes Michael Campbell and Chris Biciste. Brother has built a reputation as one of the most vocally versatile and talented bands in the state of Indiana, which makes it perfect to cover the vocal machinery of Queen.

Fawn Liebowitz will pay homage to the original chameleon of rock and roll, David Bowie, whose popularity spans five decades and counting. From psychedelic folk and glam rock to soul, R&B and electronica, Bowie played it all. Fawn Liebowitz is a well-known Fort Wayne band with two records, *Loyalty* and *Bug*, which won Whatzup’s award for Album of the Year in 2001.

Flamingo Nosebleed will play the influential songs of The Ramones, the band often credited as the first punk rock group. Creating a conduit for The Ramones, Flamingo Nosebleed will bring its three-chord, three-piece punk rock band to the Embassy stage.

Huckleberry Blue will perform the classic country songs of Hank Williams. Billed as rough around the edges country, Huckleberry Blue is a six-piece band from Columbia City, Ind., with songs about drinkin', lovin' and fightin' topping its play list.

Thunderhawk will perform The Beatles' self-titled album, often referred to as the White Album. As the most famous imports from Liverpool, England, The Beatles continue to be the most recognized rock group in history. Thunderhawk is a group of fresh-faced boys that sound as if they spent their formative years listening to a radio station where glorious, early-'90s Indie Rock dominated the airwaves. For the initiated, think a tasty meld of fuzzy guitars, unexpected arrangement zigzags and vocals that veer from passionate to couldn't care less.

Down the Line, a truly unique celebration of music, the arts and community, is a fundraiser for the Embassy Theatre as well as a considerable opportunity for local acts to play legendary music on the renowned Embassy stage. *Down the Line* artistic direction is provided by Matt Kelley, owner of One Lucky Guitar, and is generously sponsored by Hoosier Park Racing & Casino.
